



CAMPBELL COUNTY UTILITIES AND SERVICE AUTHORITY

Due to persistent regional drought conditions, Campbell County Utilities and Service Authority (CCUSA) is now supplying the Wards Road and Timberlake Road areas with water from the City of Lynchburg. A map which shows the affected areas can be found on the CCUSA website. Both the CCUSA and City of Lynchburg water quality remains excellent and there is no risk of service interruptions. As valves are opened at connection points between the two water systems, customers in the Wards Road and Timberlake Road areas may temporarily experience discolored water. This discoloration can occur when changes in water flow disturb naturally occurring sediment within water lines and does not necessarily indicate a problem.

If you notice slight discoloration in your water, then run a cold-water faucet in your bathtub for 3 to 5 minutes. If the water does not clear up, then call our office at 434-239-8654.

CCUSA's water source, the Big Otter River, continues to flow lower than normal with the extended period of low rainfall. CCUSA monitors flow conditions in the Big Otter River daily and follows our established drought response plan. Supplying parts of the CCUSA service area with water from the City of Lynchburg will delay and hopefully avoid mandatory water restrictions in the future. Voluntary conservation measures are still in effect and more information can be found on our website.
